

# Outdoor amenities at your doorstep!



Thousand Hills State Park and Forest Lake: a 573 acre lake in the middle of a 3,080 acre state park. The lake is known for great fishing opportunities, hiking trails, petroglyphs, camping cabins, a marina, and more!



Active Mobility: Kirksville offers a variety of recreational opportunities, while improving community health. Currently, Kirksville's active mobility system touts 51 miles of public sidewalk and 9.5 miles of bike lanes/trails. This system is planned to expand in the coming years to ensure safe and well-connected routes to everyday community destinations. In addition, a privately planned and funded trail will complement Kirksville's system by connecting Downtown Kirksville to the neighboring Thousand Hills State Park.



Municipal Parks: 10 city owned parks that offer swimming, a disc golf course, dog park, softball/baseball fields, and inclusive playground



Hunting: The Missouri Department of Conversation regulates hunting on five separate recreation areas that make up 12,537 acres.





# A small community robust of resources for healthcare!



Northeast Regional Medical Center: regional hospital that is a Level III Trauma Center.



Northeast Missouri Health Council: Federally qualified health center and VA clinic.



Preferred Family Healthcare is a nonprofit behavior health organization, and includes federally qualified health centers in Missouri and Illinois. Currently it operates in four states.



Complete Family Medicine/Urgent Care serves a multi-county area with primary care and operates the school based health center at the Kirksville R-III School District.



Mark Twain Behavioral Health is a private not-forprofit Certified Community Behavioral Health Clinic serving our community and nine surrounding counties. They provide services to all ages including crisis prevention, therapy, and psychiatric services.

# Transportation—Kirksville is easily connected to the tri-state region and beyond!



Highways: Kirksville is on US Highway 63, a major north-south highway from Iowa into Missouri. At Kirksville, US 63 becomes a four-lane highway south to US Interstate 70 in Columbia, MO (about 90 miles). A two-lane alternate by-pass of US Highway 63 on the east city limits of Kirksville allows commercial trucks to avoid stop-and-go traffic on our business route. Kirksville is only 34 miles north of US Highway 36, the Chicago to Kansas City Expressway.



Airport: The Kirksville Regional Airport is located four miles south of Kirksville on US 63. It is the largest hub within a 100 mile radius. CapeAir offers three daily commercial flights from Kirksville to St. Louis for as low as \$19 one way. Full FBO and Parts 139 airport.




Railroad: Amtrak Passenger Service is available in La Plata, MO, just 14 miles south of Kirksville along US Highway 63, the Burlington-Northern/Santa Fe Railroad and Amtrak make stops in La Plata, MO. A person can travel by railroad to Chicago or Kansas City from here.






